HANEN LANGUAGE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

Learning Language and Loving It is an in-service education program that equips teachers with practical, interactive strategies for building the social, language and early literacy skills of preschool children. Thanks to the program's three-pronged approach aimed at prevention, intervention and enrichment, our teachers and classroom assistants continue to learn how to ensure that *every* child in the classroom receives the support he/she needs – including those with language delays and those who are second-language learners. Our teachers are using these strategies to build language skills in your children everyday.

BABY DOLL CIRCLE TIME

We also know it's hard for young children to be away from their parents and for you to be away from your children. Baby Doll Circle Time helps us form more caring relationships, and bridge the gap between the home family and the school family. The children interact with their baby dolls in the same ways we interact with the children individually. If we play peek-a-boo, stop and go, or tickling games with your child, your child will play the same game with the baby doll. In doing so, the children re-experience our connections over and over again, helping to optimize their development.

BOOK SHARING FOR EARLY LITERACY

Your children are learning the basic steps for requesting an adult or sibling to read to them, how to handle a book and turn the pages and how to follow along as the story is read. These skills will help your child become more familiar with book sharing and prepare your child for reading when he/she is older. Spending time sharing books at home is an investment in learning.

PUERTO RICO CHILD WELFARE TEAM VISITS FDLRS-UM MDC

Our FDLRS-UM MDC, in collaboration with Judge Cindy Lederman and the Juvenile Court, hosted a multi-disciplinary team from Puerto Rico. The Judge and child welfare team from PR came to observe the partnership activities between our early intervention services and trainings, and the court. Hope is for continued collaboration activities between the Miami team and Puerto Rico.



PARENT SATISFACTION SURVEY
